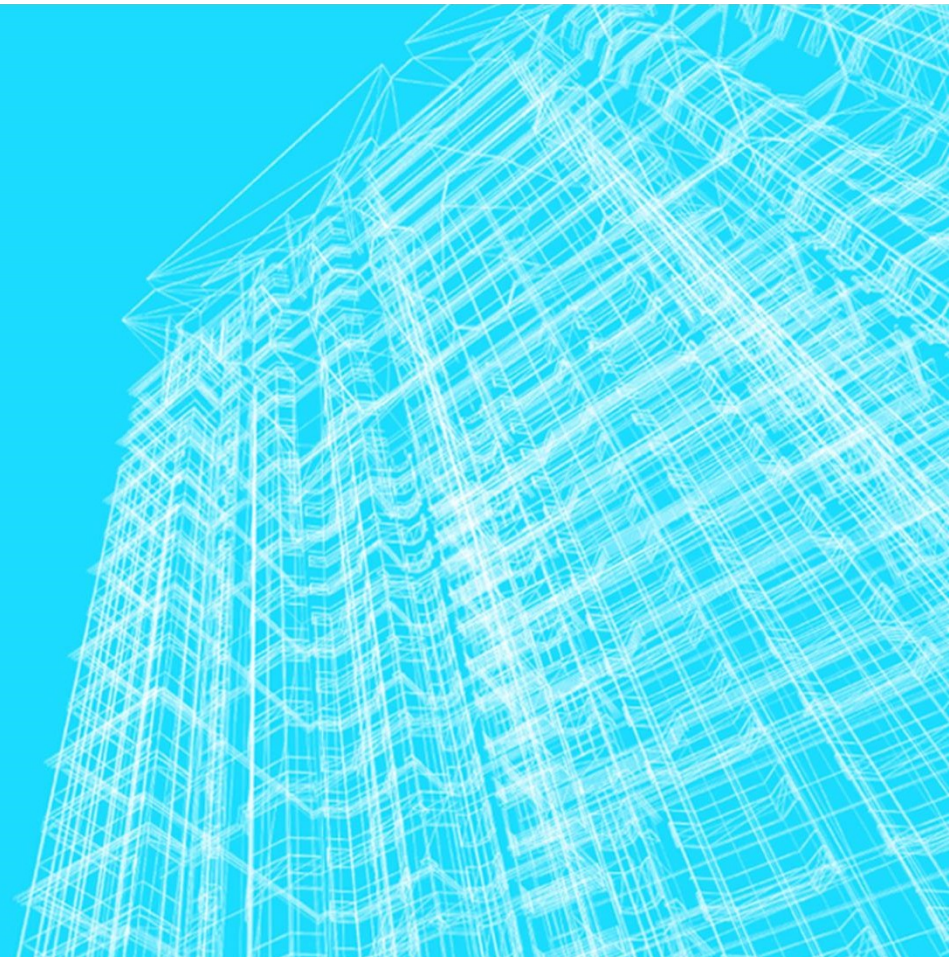

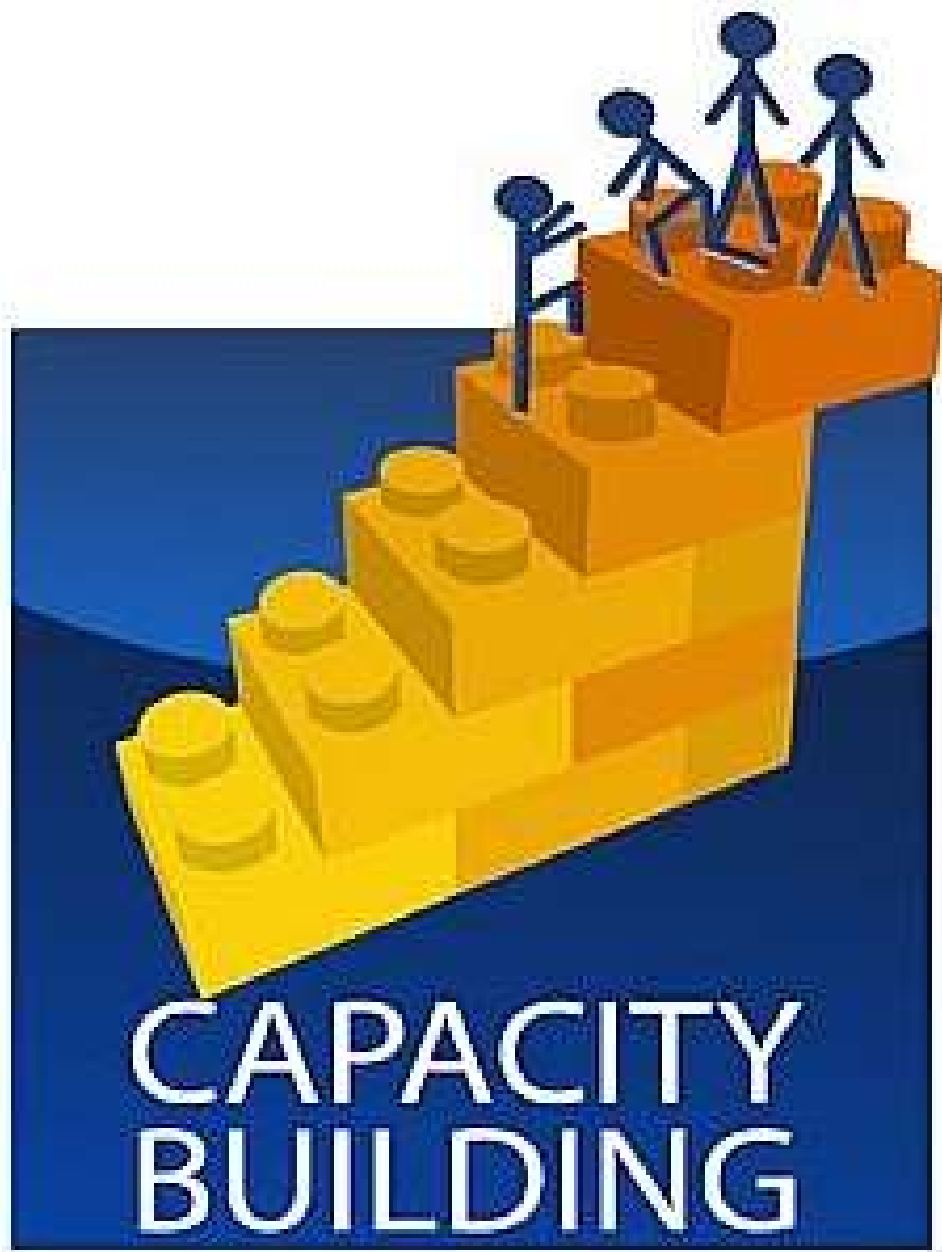
KEY INSIGHTS FROM AUDIENCE

- Capacities can take many shapes and forms for similar goals
- “The burden of the past” is often the context/momentum explaining the capacity; national policy framework is lacking ambition, there’s a lack of coordination between stakeholders or groups etc.
- Capacities should be anchored in real people and their real problems to function in reality
- Capacities should be kept simple and operational with a clear vision



3 FICTIONAL CAPACITIES (GROUP WORK)

- Example 1: Boost green procurement capacity in local authorities (by standard templates and formats for procurement and guidance teams for assistance) – to speed up contribution by local authorities to energy efficiency
- Example 2: Strengthen demand-side effort in the public sector, typically dominated by supply-side mentality (by creating initiatives targeted public sector such as green walks, seminars and trainings)
- Example 3: Accelerate the energy transition in Poland (by a project of real pilot cases, demonstrating job creation and financial value created, possibly by leveraging EU funds)
